Yours of 1st <u>inst</u> recd. The despatch was from me. We had been organizing new territories & inasmuch as Stanton had positively refused to authorize you to raise a brigade and knowing you were fancy free, it suggested itself to

my mind that I might Mr[.] Lincoln to give me an appointment in the Territories. If so you could take it. I must confess that I have almost despaired of getting anything done in the way of patronage here this winter. It requires a degree of subservience that I hate. If Lincoln consents to appoint, some secretary interferes and he caves. I should have written you but I have been confined by sickness. If I can get you a good appointment, I will get it. If it be worth nothing in position or compensation, I shall

not take it. I shall write you soon. Success to you for Mayor.
