## S.W. Eldridge

Sir[,]

I have submitted to the Committee a proposition in writing that they appropriate <u>Five Thousand</u> Dollars of the Funds intrusted to them to repair & build again, for Lawrence and for Kansas--<u>a Hotel</u>-upon the old historic site of the <u>Free State Hotel</u>--And that they select the Mayor of Lawrence, or some other agency--to execute the trust under such conditions as they may deem it their duty to impose.

I have also suggested, that their agent--the Mayor--or some one else--see that the money is <u>paid</u>--as the <u>work progresses</u>, and further--that when the Hotel is finished

and furnished--successfully as before--their agent <u>then</u>--and not before--shall collect 5 pr cent annually from the Hotel--upon the sum advanced by this Committee--<u>provided</u>, that there shall then be <u>widows</u> and <u>orphan children</u>, made so by this Raid--not otherwise provided for--which same shall thereafter be annually expended for the education & support.

This last provis--sweetens the thing--and I have little doubt that it will pass.

The Committee has not met yet--but I have got them privately to favor it.

I expect to be in Southampton on the Sabbath--and return here on Monday.
