June 24 from a woman. Miss Routt's Address was perhaps more classically beautiful but this was full of a wonderful vigor. What impressed me chiefly was that every one of Scholars had been trained to a false artificial system of gesture. But Miss Wilson bursting the bonds of conventialism was true and telling in every movement and tone. She thrilled every nerve with exquisite delight by her impassioned manner and words. I have heard great men in the nation's councils who could not equal that Address. If her mind corresponds to this specimen, she might under proper influence have a man in the world not "fameless."

In the evening Commencement Exercises of Wm. Jewel College. Excellent. B.R. Vineyard gave us another fine speech on "Immortality." The colloquy or Drama rather was well acted.

Saw one of our guns burst--[8?] dead rebels--dead horses numerous--fences leveled.
